Bullitt County Public Schools Join Dataseam Partnership

LOUISVILLE, Kentucky (February 16, 2026) - Dataseam has announced that Bullitt County Public Schools, voted to join the statewide Dataseam partnership at their January 2026 Board of Education meeting.

Participating public schools, generally the largest employer in most 120 Kentucky counties, earn high-end Apple workstations addressing curriculum needs reflective of a knowledge-based workforce. These computers comprise the statewide DataseamGrid supporting the Commonwealth’s research and commercialization efforts at the University of Louisville’s Brown Cancer Center.

Dataseam now serves 60 Kentucky districts statewide accounting for 40% of the state’s approximately 630,000 K-12 public school students.
